

Thank you to Fr. Chris and the parish for making year 4 so welcome at Mass this week. All our classes take turns to join the parish for Mass at St. Cuthbert's Church each Friday morning and we are always delighted when you are able to join us. All children who are not going to Boggle Hole will join the parish for Mass this Wednesday and to receive ashes and mark the start of the Lenten season. Mass is at 9.30am and we would love you to join us and help walk the children to and from Church. Our next whole school Mass

after this Wednesday will be on Wednesday 3rd April at 9.30am in St. Cuthbert's Church. We will be joining our friends from Christ Church and St. Joseph's to perform our Easter Passion at Northumberland Square on Tuesday 2nd April. We will end this term with our Early Years and Key Stage 1 Easter play in school on Thursday 4th April when the children will retell the story of Jesus' sacrifice for us all. Details for each event will be sent out later this half term. We will also be holding daily opportunities for families to join us in prayer and reflection throughout Lent



and we will send more details of what we are doing and when next week.

Our whole school attendance is a very good 97.1% for the week and year 1 have won the trophy with a near perfect 99.1%.

Thank you to everone who came to school to chat with class teachers this week. We are always delighted at the turnout we get at St. Cuthbert's with over 85% of our families coming to the meetings. If you think you could be entitled to free school meals and milk for your child it's really easy to apply via the council's website https://my.northtyneside.gov.uk/category/238/free-schoolmeals. You may be entitled if you are in receipt of income support/job seekers allowance/support under the immigration and asylum act/Universal credit/child tax credit without working tax credit. Even if you are unsure it is worth applying to make sure you are not missing out. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to free meals at school but you must make an application for this. It's really easy to do via the council website https://my.northtyneside.gov.uk/category/238/free-school-meals

It is very important that all our children are signed up for Universal Free School Meals, even if your child prefers a packed lunch. If you have any questions about school meals at all please call into the school office.



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Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) drop-in sessions at St Cuthbert's.

Miss Shepherd, our SEND coordinator would like to invite parents and carers to drop in sessions on the morning of the first Wednesday of every month should you have any concerns or questions to answer about any issue relating to SEND.

Partnership with parents

As stated in our SEND policy:

"Partnership plays a key role in enabling children and young people with SEND to achieve their potential. Parents hold key information and have knowledge and experience to contribute to the shared view of a child's needs. All parents/carers of children with special educational needs will be treated as partners and be given support to play an active and valued role in their child's education.

Children and young people with special educational needs often have a unique knowledge of their own needs and their views about what sort of help they would like. They will be encouraged to contribute to the assessment of their needs, the review and transition process.

The school website contains details of our policy for special educational needs and the local offer that includes the provision made for children with SEND. At all stages of the special needs process, the school keeps parents fully informed and involved. We take account of the wishes, feelings and knowledge of parents at all stages".
